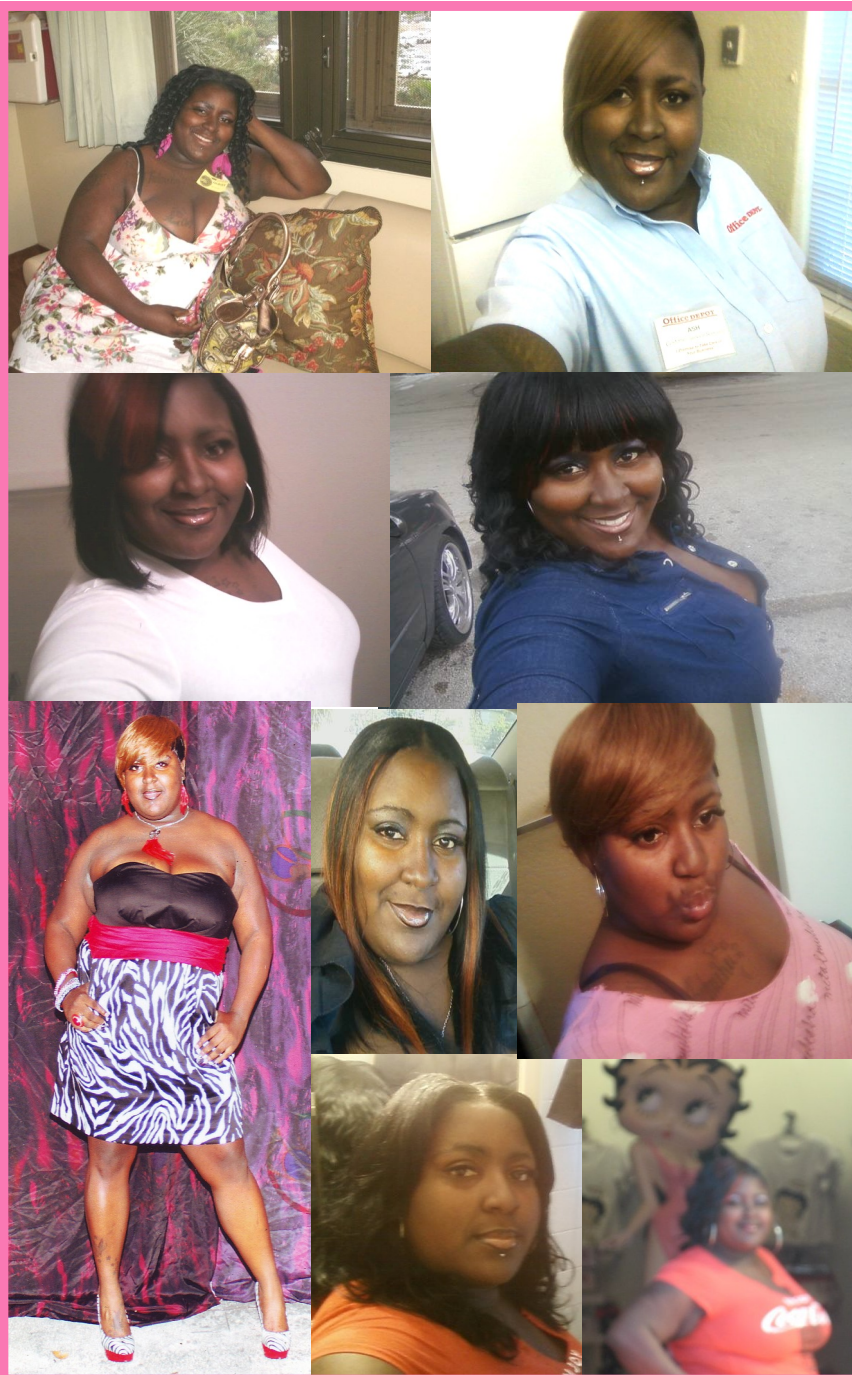


Ashley Nicole Pluviose
