


At nineteen, Darien Smith had his whole life ahead of him. He attended college, worked part-time, jogged every morning and loved to dance. But all of that changed in an instant, when an on-the-job accident left Darien paralyzed and left Linda to fight for his life. He took a fall of almost 20 feet, hitting his head on the way down. Instead of being rushed to the hospital, Darien was sent home to rest. He returned to work where he was again injured to the same area of the head during his effort to do the best job he could for this company. Again, he was sent home. Three months later, while at work, Darien complained of shooting pains from his neck into his head. This time, Darien was rushed to the hospital. When his mother arrived, he was unresponsive. After performing many tests on Darien the hospital finally found that an injury to his brain stem had left him paralyzed from the mouth down.

"They told me that Darien's injury was more severe than any injury that they had ever seen," wrote his mother Linda McCoy. "As they explained it: the specific injury had caused an infarc of the brainstem and that no one had ever lived with an injury level that high." No but Darien, his mother and their family expected Darien live.

"I went home to my mother's house, knelt down in prayer and searched for answers, and said to God: 'I taught my son everything you told me. To love you, to be a good man, everything, and he's asking me why, and I don't have an answer for why this happened", wrote McCoy. "Then the Spirit said to me, 'Go tell him to remember JOB'."

Calling on her unwavering faith in God and her belief that love is the most powerful force in the universe, Linda fought tooth and nail for Darien's right to live a full and productive life despite his injuries. When government and corporate agents refused him nursing care, housing and even his right to stay alive, Linda took them all on and brought Darien the justice he deserved. Handling adversity with patience and a will to thrive no matter how hard it might seem Darien and Linda continue to prove that anyone who trusts in God can triumph against any and all odds.

"I want readers after putting this book down to never give up... in particular younger readers, to not take life for granted, because tomorrow is promised to no one," – Darien Smith.
